

English

We will read The Watertower by Gary Crew and The Boy in the Tower by Polly Ho-Yen.

We will be writing the following text types:

Narrative: First person narrative and Third person narrative

Non-Fiction: Non-chronological report

We will continue to develop our knowledge of grammar learnt in Y6 as well as revisiting grammar from previous years.

Maths

In maths this term we will be looking at fractions. Throughout the topic we will be learning to identify name and write equivalent fractions, representing them visually including tenths and hundreds. We will also be learning to recognise mixed numbers and improper fractions and convert from one form to the other and write mathematical statements.

Science

In our Evolution topic this term, we will learn the following:

- Living things change over time and fossils provide information about living things that inhabited Earth years ago
- Living things produce offspring of the same kind, but vary
- Animals and plants adapt to their environment.

Computing

We will learn to organise data into columns and rows to create our own data set. We will learn the importance of formatting data to support calculations, while also being introduced to formulas and begin to understand how they can be used to produce calculated data. Finally, we will create charts, and evaluate our results.

Art

This term we will be looking at 3-D art and sculpture and studying how artists use experiences to help formulate their ideas and plan their art. We will be doing this by completing a piece of work in cardboard.

RE

We will be looking at right and wrong through different religions as well as looking at what decisions we make. While completing this unit we will be deep diving into the morals of Buddhists, Christians and Islamic religions. We will also look at morality.

Music

In music this term we will be learning how to create music to accompany a short film about race, composing an extended melody and accompaniment.

Home Learning

Reading, reading and more reading. Reading at home is essential to your child's reading development and fluency. It does not have to be the whole book – in year 6 the children are expected to read a minimum of 10 pages every day which will need recording in their reading records.

TTRS can also be accessed to help secure their times table and division knowledge.

Additional homework may be given to individuals or whole class depending on areas that need to be revisited or reinforced. The children will have the tasks carefully explained when necessary.

PE

We will develop our swimming and gymnastic skills. Gymnastics will be taken place in the hall, where we will be learning all types of balances, jumps and rolls. Please remember to come in correct PE kit to school. Or bring your swimming kit into school. Now the weather is changing please send your child in warm clothing.

PSHE

This term, Year 5 will be focusing on puberty and how our bodies develop and change as we grow. Year 6 will be looking at conception. We will study the reproductive system for male and female and look at how conception takes place as well as how a baby grows.

Spanish

In Spanish, we will be building on what we have learnt from last term looking at the describing others as well as building in dates.
